


WCHS Dress Code

Wesley Chapel High School expects all students to dress appropriately for the school setting. We believe that holding students accountable for appropriate dress will promote responsible citizenship and provide a positive learning environment for all.



Students in violation of the dress code:

- Will be required to change into appropriate clothing, contacting the parent/guardian as needed
- Students may be required to remain in the front office until the above condition is met per principal discretion
- May receive a discipline referral and receive consequences as appropriate for repeated breaches of the policy



Hats, bandannas, and head coverings are **NOT** permitted unless approved by administration for medical or religious reasons, or for special school

Dog collars, spiked collars, or jewelry that cause safety issues or disrupt the learning environment are **NOT** permitted.

Clothing **MUST** cover the body from one armpit across to the other armpit and down to mid-thigh.

Tops **MUST** be at least 1" across and be long enough to overlap the belt line or stay tucked in during the course of normal movement throughout the school day.

NO abdomen, back, side skin or underwear should be exposed.

Leggings, shorts, skirts, yoga pants, or similar clothing **MUST** be mid-thigh in length.

Jeans or pants may **NOT** have rips or holes that expose undergarments or areas of the body that generally are covered by undergarments.

Shoes **MUST** be worn for hygienic reasons and foot protection while on school grounds and transportation.

Any clothing item, accessories or apparel is considered inappropriate for school if it exposes underwear or abdomen skin, contains/displays profanity in any form, violent images, vulgarity in any form, advertisements of/ or usage of tobacco, alcohol, or drugs, and/or sexually suggestive/implicit/explicit images, words, or phrases, and any gang-related images and/or images that signify gang affiliation or antisocial group affiliation.

The Principal, or designee, shall determine the appropriateness of dress and appearance. The Principal, or designee, will make the decision if a student's appearance meets school and community standards. The Principal's decision on the appropriateness of dress is final.
