Grading Categories

WCHS will use TWO grading categories in myStudent:

Formative

Summative

FORMATIVE:

40% - sequential standards

60% - recursive standards

- Comprehension Checks
- Homework
- Quizzes

SUMMATIVE:

60% - At Least 3 Per Quarter

40% - At Least 3 Per Quarter

- Chapter Tests
- Common Assessments
- Projects (NO Collaborative Grades)

STANDARDS-BASED GRADING

All grades must be based on mastery of the standards graded.

- No grades awarded for completion, participation, or behavior
- No extra credit
- Assignment in myStudent labeled by name, date, and category
- Grades updated in myStudent weekly

MAKE-UP WORK

- Students may make up any and all assignments, tests or related work on the day(s) of any excused or unexcused absence for full credit.
- The student is responsible for asking the teacher(s) for make up tests, assignments and related work. Work not completed in the designated time will be counted as late (See Late Work).
- Students will be given a minimum of two (2) calendar days per day or period of absence to make up all tests, assignments and related work.
- Students may be given additional time as stipulated on their IEP or based on teacher discretion. Work due to be turned in on the day of an absence will be turned in upon return and be given full credit.
- Students who have been assigned out-of-school suspension (OSS) may make up all tests, assignments, and related work.

SCHOOL-WIDE RETAKES

Teachers will allow formative and/or summative retakes as posted in the course syllabus as decided by department. The student is responsible for requesting a retake and completing all assigned remediation prior to the retake.

LATE WORK

Late work will receive no more than a 20% deduction with the last date being determined by the department and posted in the course syllabus.
