## A CREDIT IS A UNIT OF MEASURE FOR COURSES COMPLETED

- A unit of measure for courses completed
  - 1 semester class = 1/2 credit
  - 1 year long class = 1 full credit
  - Each year you need to earn 6 credits, 3 credits per semester.
- If a course is failed for the semester, no credit is awarded
- 24 credits are needed for a Standard Diploma

#### HOW IS GPA CALCULATED?

All grades have a numerical equivalent a/k/a "Quality Points"

$$A = 4$$
 points  $B = 3$  pts  $C = 2$  pts  $D = 1$  pt  $F = 0$  pts

Students must have a 2.0 GPA in order to earn a diploma.

Total quality points earned divided by total classes = GPA



#### BEWARE THE DANGER OF A ZERO

An overwhelming percentage of students who fail a class have at least ONE zero.

#### AP CAPSTONE

AP Capstone Diploma is a nationally recognized advanced diploma offered by College Board. (The same company that offers PSAT, SAT, and AP)

#### It requires:

- 4 AP courses with passing AP exam scores (score of 3 is passing)
- AP Seminar course in 11th grade
- AP Research course in 12th grade

#### THE IMPORTANCE OF ATTENDANCE

ATTENDANCE IS ONE OF THE BEST INDICATORS OF HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT PERFORMANCE



#### WCHS believes that EVERY student can learn

- Learning must be a daily occurrence
- Attendance includes missed individual classes
- 10 minutes of "Tardiness" per day can equal 15 instructional hours lost in a semester



#### WHY ATTENDANCE MATTERS

- HS Freshmen who miss 10 days of school in a semester fail two classes on average.
- Students with <u>high test scores</u> who miss more than two weeks of school in a semester, are <u>more likely to fail</u> than students with <u>low test scores</u> who miss <u>less than one week</u> of school.



### WHAT CAN "WE" DO?

- Monitor student grades and attendance.
- Talk about the importance of school and attendance and consider consequences.
- Make sure that the school contact information is correct.
- Ensure that students are well rested and fed breakfast.
- Consider if an adult would go to work, then a student should probably go to school.



### Bright Futures: Florida Academic Scholars

- 3.5 weighted GPA in core classes (plus two years foreign language)
- AP Computer Science does not count for a BF math credit.
- 1340 SAT or 29 ACT
- 100 community service hours or 100 work-based hours
- 100% tuition and fees paid to a Florida public university or college
- Renewable for four years (3.0 GPA/minimum 12 hours per semester)





### Bright Futures: Florida Medallion Scholars

- 3.0 weighted GPA in core classes (plus two years foreign language)
- AP Computer Science does not count for a BF math credit.
- 1210 SAT or 25 ACT
- 75 community service hours or 100 work-based hours
- 75% tuition and fees paid to a Florida public university or college (100% paid for state/community college)
- Renewable for four years (2.75 GPA and a minimum 12 hours per semester)





### Bright Futures: Gold Seal Scholars

- 3.0 weighted GPA in non-elective courses
- 3.5 unweighted GPA in vocational courses (3 credits in vocational program)
- 4 English/4 Math/3 Nat. Science/3 Social Science/HOPE
- Qualifying scores on ACT, SAT, or PERT
- 30 community service hours or work-based hours
- \$39-\$48 per credit hour (depending on program)
- Up to 72 college credit hours in a vocational program of study





### University Considerations



- Rigor of coursework (AP/Dual Enrollment, additional math/science courses, most difficult classes offered)
- Two years/units of the same foreign language
- GPA (weighted core semester grades 9th-11th grade years)
- SAT or ACT scores (all Florida public universities)
- Holistic Review: Essay, Service, Leadership, Extracurricular
